In June 2015 the DfE published "The Prevent Duty: Departmental advice for schools" which explains how and why schools have a duty to protect children from the dangers of radicalisation.

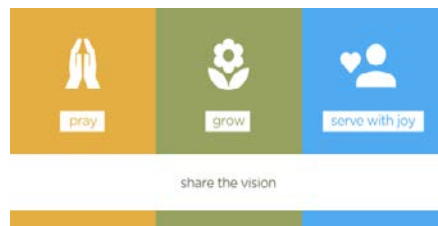
