MARCH PRAYER DIARY

Friday 1st – Saturday 9th

During Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month, we pray for all those living with ovarian cancer, and their families and friends. We pray that in their pain they would know the love you have for them. We give thanks for organisations working to discover new ways to prevent and treat ovarian cancer.

1. On the World Day of Prayer 2024, we join with the global church – led by Christian women in Palestine – in praying the words of *Ephesians 4:1-6*, that we would 'bear with one another in love, eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.'

2. For the Paignton Mission Community, its clergy Neil Knox, and for all who live and worship in Paignton.

3. On World Wildlife Day, we remember that you gave us the Earth to cherish and steward, convict us to do what we can to protect all you have created. 'The earth is the Lord's and everything in it' (*Psalm 24:1*).

Sunday 24th – Sunday 31st

During Holy Week, we remember your journey to the cross, that you suffered many things, were rejected, betrayed and killed to save us. May we be filled with awe and thanksgiving at what you endured for us, and filled with hope that you rose from the dead and conquered the grave.

24. On Palm Sunday we remember Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem as people shouted 'Hosanna', which means save us, 'blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord' (*Mark 11:9*). May we rejoice in you today and always, our King and Saviour.

25. On the Feast of the Annunciation, when the angel told Mary she would give birth to Jesus, we remember her willingness to trust God. We pray Mary's faith would inspire us to say: 'I am the Lord's servant.' May your will be done in our lives.

26. On Epilepsy Awareness Day or 'Purple Day', we pray for the 600,000 people in the UK affected by epilepsy and give thanks for the organisations researching ways to improve the lives of people with epilepsy.

27. For the churches of the St Andrew & St Paul Mission Community, their clergy Joe Dent, Leon Sim, Tim Partridge, Philip Cairns, LLM David Huntley, and for all who live and worship in St Paul Stonehouse and St Andrew Plymouth.

28. On Maundy Thursday, we remember Jesus washing the feet of his disciples, saying 'Unless I wash you, you have no part with me.'


Lord, thank you that you have washed us and made us clean. Help us to follow your example of humbly serving and your instruction to 'wash one another's feet.' (John 13:1-7)

On Easter Saturday, we reflect on the significance of the cross, and pray for those who don't yet know the truth and hope of Christ' death and resurrection: 'For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.' (John 3:16)

31. On Easter Sunday, we proclaim Christ is risen, he has conquered the grave! Remind us that the same power that raised Christ from the dead, is at work in us. We have been raised with Christ, help us to set our hearts on things above (*Colossians 3:1*). We wait and pray for your return.
