

Reflecting on the words of Romans 1:16, we pray:

Lord, help us to remember that the gospel is good news for all people. Help us to be confident and passionate about the gospel, not ashamed or embarrassed, for through it God saves all who believe it. Give us boldness to share it with those who have not heard it.

We encourage you to reflect on this passage throughout this month and use it to guide your prayer time.

### Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> – Saturday 4<sup>th</sup>

During Maternal Mental Health Awareness Week, we pray for women experiencing mental health problems during pregnancy or postnatally, especially those who struggle to share this with others. We give thanks for the gift of motherhood, help us to care for and support those struggling with their mental health, and reflect your love to them.

1. On the Feast Day of Philip and James the Apostles, whom you chose as your disciples, we remember their faith, their willingness to follow, and their courageous witness of your truth. We pray that you would give us boldness in our own witness, and help us to trust in you, Jesus.

We ask for renewed faith and perseverance to pray for their salvation.

11. On World Fair Trade Day, we give thanks for organisations and activists committed to building healthy, equitable, sustainable communities around the world. We pray for those currently living and working in unfair systems and particularly those whose livelihoods are most impacted by climate change.

I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God that brings salvation to everyone who believes.

### Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> – Saturday 18<sup>th</sup>

During Christian Aid Week, we pray for churches and communities engaging with this year's theme: 'Extraordinary Love'. Lord, you showed us what love is by laying down your life for us, help us reflect that same sacrificial love through fervent prayer, generous giving and courageous action.

12. During Mental Health Awareness Week, we pray for all those struggling with their mental health, that they would know that the Lord is a very present help in times of trouble. Help us to support, encourage and pray for one another when we become overwhelmed.


