Lists A & B


- List A
  - No consultation
- List B
  - Permission from Archdeacon in consultation with DAC
- 157 List B applications in 2016
- Totalling works of more than £1,026,000

- Repairs
- Contents
- Churchyards
  - Benches
  - Repair / rebuilding of walls
  - Lychgates
  - Works to trees
