Christian leadership is best exercised in community. It isn't a solo venture, but involves leading well with others, from the PCC to the Church Wardens, from leadership teams to staff, from leaders of small groups to leaders of activities.

This event explores both how to engage people, and how to make sense of Anglican structures so that we can ensure we exercise leadership that encourages the growth and health of the local church. CPAS currently work with many dioceses in supporting them as they seek to build and strengthen a culture of collaborative leadership and, following a recent refresh of their vision, increasingly with a focus on leading in evangelism.

Revd Charles Burgess is a leadership specialist with CPAS. He is also an Associate Vicar of a parish comprising two churches in Salisbury Diocese, his wife Jane being the incumbent. Charles has many years of practical leadership experience both from a career in the RAF and, in the last 12 years, through his role with CPAS.

To say that 2020 has been quite the year would probably be considered an understatement. 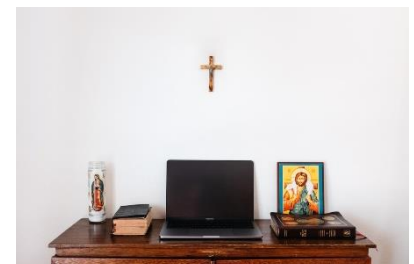
**LIVESTREAMING WITH STYLE

More people than we expected tuned in to online church last spring. Now the changing mix of online and in person church makes life more complex and confusing. In the long term, how can we make the best of both worlds, growing and feeding disciples both in person and online without running out of time, energy and money? How can we mix online and in person both effectively and efficiently? Bob will help us learn from each other and reflect on our own situations as we plan for a new church world.

Bob Jackson was a Government Economic Adviser in the days before Mrs Thatcher was invented. After twenty years of parish ministry in Yorkshire he became a 'Springboard Missioner' then an archdeacon. More recently he has focussed on the theory and practise of church growth. Having tried to retire he came out of retirement to help think through good practice and the future of online church. He leads a families-based fresh expression of church in his village of Eyam in Derbyshire and invents pilgrimage routes in his spare time.

Encouraging Vocations in the parish and Understanding the Six Qualities (the new C of E shared discernment process for authorised ordained ministry).

Revd John Fisher is the Diocesan Director of Ordinands. He will take you through the new national discernment framework for authorised ordained ministry in the Church of England. The Six Qualities replaces the nine criteria previously used and the way that the Bishops Advisory Panels work is changing from Autumn 2021. How this works and how the DDO team in the diocese will share in this process will be explained so that you are informed and ready for the changes. They will be a chance to ask questions and learn why the changes are being made.

Revd Hannah Mears is the Diocesan Vocations Development Officer and also serves in Bradninch parish. She will be helping us think through the tricky subject of encouraging and nurturing vocations (lay and ordained) to authorised ministries. The Church needs its workers and an important parochial task is helping to identify new talent and realising potential in all people. Hannah will share some ideas and principles to help you do this in your setting.

For any Clergy in full time/half time/sector ministry (and their spouses and partners) in Exeter Diocese, who are within two years/eighteen months or less of their retirement.

Accompanying others through the varied stages of their life story is an important and rewarding part of ordained ministry. Attentiveness to our own journey is just as important but can too easily be neglected amidst the demands of caring for others.

Preparing for retirement is one such life stage.

The aims of these days are:

- To help prepare clergy and their spouses/partners for a satisfying and fruitful retirement.
- To provide an opportunity to reflect on the social, emotional, and spiritual aspects of retirement.
- To consider what it means to leave a parish/ministry post well.
- For participants to go away with a plan of action for/clearer picture of the years and months leading up to retirement and having begun to anticipate some of the early transitions life in retirement brings.

What this journey involves is unique to each of us. There will be time for discussion and personal reflection. Resources for individuals and couples will be available for use before, between and after these two days.

Rev Sue Tucker. Sue retired to this diocese after twenty years of ministry. She left a busy parish in Somerset and overnight had an empty diary and was living in a place where she didn't know anyone.

John Carter is a qualified counsellor, supervisor and trainer with many years of experience, working variously in private practice, counselling agencies and as part of an occupational health team in industry. He has particular experience of supporting those in Christian ministry.

Mental Health First Aid – half-day introductions

January to May 2021

with trainer Ben Slater from *fiveways* Devon

The Diocese of Exeter is working with training provider *fiveways devon* to deliver a range of Mental Health First Aid courses accredited by Mental Health First Aid England. The vision is for churches and their members to serve, understand and welcome their communities by having high quality training and support.

fiveways devon are very generously subsidising half-day introductory training for as many as Christians as possible, subsequent more in-depth training for a network of local champions, and facilitating free follow-up peer support sessions. This is open to all denominations, both clergy and lay people. **Are you in?!**

- 1 in 4 of us will experience mental health difficulties in any given year.
- Being misunderstood when seeking help or going to a place of perceived safety (such as a church) can significantly set back recovery and in some cases can trigger an episode of severe mental ill health.
- The renewing of our minds and helping the vulnerable are two strong biblical principles that sit at the heart of serving others in Jesus' name.
- *fiveways devon* has a 100% good or above trainee satisfaction rate in Mental Health First Aid Training
- Accredited by the Royal Society of Public Health
- Mental Health First Aid England is the only provider of licensed MHFA training in England.

Half Day Youth Online Course (3h)

This course has specific examples about interactions with young people; most principles also apply for adults.

Topics include: What is mental health?; protective and risk factors; stigma and discrimination; mental health continuum; case studies; self-harm and suicide; signs & symptoms of mental ill health; the stress container model; recovery; self-awareness and self-care.

This course is repeated on each of the following dates, to maximise accessibility.

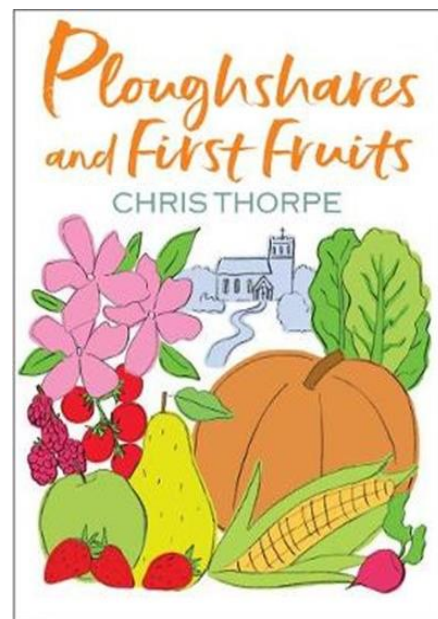
