## RESOURCES FOR SCHOOL AND HOME

- **The Greatest Story Ever Told** is a free Bible-focused collective worship resource that could be used at home or school and might be ideal for 'bubble worship'
- **Diddy Disciples** offer worship and Bible storytelling by Sharon Moughtin-Mumby: Anglican priest, Bible scholar, writer, and mother. They are streaming Bedtime Prayers (Compline), led by children, from the [Diddy Disciples Facebook page](#) every evening.
