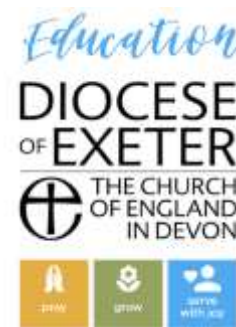

Diocesan Leadership Forums, Networks and Hubs

Diocesan Network: Governance Forum

Audience: Governors, Directors, Trustees and Clerks

This network is for Governors and Trustees/Directors to meet with the Diocesan Education Team staff and others involved in governance. At each meeting we will highlight local and national initiatives that may have an impact on the governing boards of Church of England schools; give updates on topical issues; share diocesan developments, priorities and opportunities; and signpost good practice and avenues for advice and support.

Diocesan Network: Leadership Forum for School Staff

Audience: All School Leaders (staff)

Join with the Education Team and other school leaders in this virtual network. At each meeting our aim is to provide a focussed and relevant specialist input session; to share diocesan updates, priorities and opportunities; to hear the things that are on your mind; and to signpost good practice and possible avenues of support.

Diocesan Network: MAT Leadership Forum

Audience: CEOs

The Diocesan MAT Leadership Forum meets termly to build our collective capacity to improve and serve our learners and families more effectively. Every MAT is encouraged to attend so that collectively we can:

- Create a strong and flourishing Church of England MAT network through identifying and sharing best practice;
 - Exercise our moral responsibility and our Christian duty to work in the best interests of all learners and their families as they experience education for wisdom, hope, community and dignity and discover life in all its fullness;
 - Strengthen every MAT through peer support and challenge;
 - Advise the Diocese of Exeter on matters relating to system leadership.

Diocesan Network: Open Surgery Sessions

Audience: School staff and those involved in governance

These open surgery sessions are intended for you to be able to 'drop in' and talk through anything that is on your mind. If we don't have the answers to hand, we will come back to you or connect you with someone who will be able to assist.

Diocesan Network: Secondary School Leadership Forum

Audience: Secondary School Leaders (staff)

There are five Church of England secondary schools in the Diocese of Exeter. This new forum aims to bring leaders together to focus on matters relating specifically to secondary Church schools. Diocesan Education Team members will help facilitate this forum, coming alongside you to share Diocesan updates, priorities and opportunities; to hear the things that are on your mind; and to signpost good practice and possible avenues of support. Community Secondary schools are welcome to join.

Diocesan Network: SIAMS Hubs

Audience: SIAMS leads, plus staff and Governance

Although these sessions are area specific, it really doesn't matter if you sign up to come to a meeting in a different part of the Diocese. These are informal meetings, designed to: support Church of England schools in the development of their Christian distinctiveness; act as a forum at which to share information about SIAMS related matters; allow sharing of ideas and best practice; and give an opportunity for the exploration and discussion of any challenges.

Diocesan Network: Time to recharge – spiritual refreshment

Audience: School staff, those involved in governance and regular school volunteers

Take a 30 minute break to have time to reflect, pray and to be refreshed in a dedicated time of God's presence.

Linked Network: Faith at Home Forum

Audience: School Leaders and Clergy

An open network for school and church leaders to engage with and use in their own context. Based on the principles that we need to focus on what our communities need first, and we need to take seriously the concerns of children and young people (CYP) when drawing them into conversations about faith, these sessions look at some key issues pertinent to CYP and their faith development. Training

Course Title: Admissions Code Training

Audience: All involved in schools that are their own admissions authorities

This workshop will comprehensively cover the development of high-quality admission arrangements and the specific content required by statute. We aim that attendees will leave the workshop with a clear understanding of the purpose of admission arrangements, the freedom to include or exclude particular practices, the procedure to follow for changing arrangements and a measure of the likely challenge. This workshop has been specifically organised during July 2022 in order that governors wishing to revise their arrangements on the back of the workshop experience will have time to prepare the documentation and consult during the statutory timeline.

Course Title: Admissions Code Updates

Audience: All involved in schools that are their own admissions authorities

This is an update to help guide you through the changes made to the Admissions Code and to know how they will impact your admission arrangements.

Course Title: Clerks update

Audience: Clerks / Governance Professionals of maintained schools and academies

Information sharing sessions for new and existing clerks of maintained schools, MAT Boards and Local Governing Boards to help develop support networks and to keep everyone up to date with the latest developments and best practice. The session will be an interactive workshop session focusing on a specific topic or key competency and drilling down using shared experiences and best practice.

Course Title: Courageous Advocacy and Social Action – a guide for schools

Audience: Heads of School / CEOs / School staff / Governors

This course will help schools to explore the concept of courageous advocacy and what that might mean in their unique context. It is important to move beyond simple solutions, like fundraising, to ask questions about why underlying injustices keep people poor and what can be done about it. We need to develop an understanding of the structural causes of poverty, looking at the complexities that cause injustice in order to tackle root causes, rather than simply soothing symptoms alone. Courageous advocacy can take a number of forms, and we will be exploring examples of the following: awareness raising, community influencing, lifestyle changes, consumer power and engaging with decision-makers.

Course Title: Decolonise your curriculum - Equality and Unconscious Bias

Audience: School staff and Governors

How to decolonise your curriculum? Following the Black Lives Matter protests earlier this year we will be examining how a renewed consciousness about race and equality is impacting on RE and more widely in the school curriculum. Ed Pawson will be joined by others as he leads this session.

Course Title: Director / Trustee Training

Audience: Directors / Trustees of MATs and SATs

This training is provided by the Education Team for existing and new academy trust Directors /Trustees and will cover:

- How governance in multi academy trusts works
 - An overview of the duties and legal responsibilities of a Board of Trustees
 - How the scheme of delegation works in practice

Course Title: Ethos Enhancing Outcomes

Audience: School staff and Governors

An opportunity to enable all governors and school leaders in both maintained schools and academies to work through some of the ways in which the school's vision for education can be brought to life in the everyday interaction of a school.

Course Title: Governor / Director Induction Training (and useful as refresher training)

Audience: New Governors / Directors / Trustees

The Diocese of Exeter really values its Governors and wishes to ensure all those who take on this role have the appropriate knowledge and know where to seek support. As such, it is a requirement that all newly appointed Foundation Governors and Directors attend an induction session within twelve months of their appointment. The course is open to all categories of Governors and Directors of church schools and academies, and provides the following:

- Information on the different categories of schools and the responsibilities of governors in these categories;
 - An overall understanding of Church school governance, including the role of the governor in new staff appointments, buildings and admissions;
 - Information on Religious Education, Collective Worship and SIAMS;
 - Opportunities to network with other church school governors and share good practice.

Course Title: Governance Refresher Training

Audience: Governors / Directors / Trustees reappointed to a Church school

Suitable for those in governance who have been reappointed for another term. This training is a refresher event for foundation governors that have been re-appointed as an alternative to revisiting the new governor training. Topics that will be covered include updates on RE, Collective Worship, admissions and buildings.

Course Title: Inclusive, Invitational and Inspiring Collective Worship for schools

Audience: People who contribute to Collective Worship in schools

The new [guidance document](#) identifies what best practice in terms of collective worship could look like in Church of England schools. In this three-part course we will examine this in detail and enable you to take time to audit your current provision and reflect and make improvements.

- Auditing current provision and induction training for staff and volunteers
 - Effective planning and resourcing with a church/school/home approach
 - Festivals and diversity

Course Title: Introduction to SIAMS

Audience: School Leaders, Teachers, Governors and Directors

This course will introduce teachers and school leaders to the current SIAMS framework and self-evaluation form documents. It will offer guidance on what is inspected and how to prepare fully for a future SIAMS inspection. It is aimed at all staff and governors and will be an interactive, informative and enjoyable course. The course has been costed to encourage more than one member of staff/governor to attend.

Course Title: Member training (Academies only)
Audience: Academies only - Foundation Members

Foundation Members are an important part of academy governance. This event will provide information of how to be an effective Foundation Member, what the difference is between the corporation Foundation Member and an ordinary Foundation Member, as well as the opportunity to share best practice. This training is suitable for all Foundation Members of Single Academy Trusts (SATs) and Multi Academy Trusts (MATs).

Course Title: Philosophy for Children (P4C)
Audience: School staff

Philosophy for children (P4C) is a powerful educational approach that has been found to be highly effective in the dual aims of raising attainment and improving children's enjoyment of learning. In this practical, hands-on course we will be exploring some of the central aims and methods of P4C and discussing how its techniques can be embedded into learning settings across the curriculum.

Course Title: RE Updates for Church of England Primary Schools
Audience: Primary RE teachers and RE Leads

This meeting will explore current issues for primary teachers of RE including: networking shared ideas; curriculum planning; worldviews and RE; leading and monitoring across the school; RE, Ofsted and SIAMS; what should RE look like in a Church school?

Course Title: RE Updates for Church of England Secondary Schools
Audience: Secondary RE teachers and RE Leads

This meeting will explore current issues for Church of England secondary RE teachers including: networking shared ideas; KS3/4 programmes and planning; GCSE updates; RE, Ofsted and SIAMS; what is a worldviews approach; what does RE look like in a Church school?

Course Title: RE and Worldviews
Audience: RE teachers and RE Leads

In 2018 the National Commission on RE ([CoRE](#)) recommended that RE be renamed as Religion and Worldviews. This course aims to give teachers in schools an understanding of the way the new worldviews approach is impacting on RE in the classroom. What are worldviews and what difference does this approach make to what and how we teach?

Course Title: Relationships, Sex, Health Education (RSHE)
Audience: School Leaders, Teachers, Governors, Directors

This course will give an introduction to the [Goodness and Mercy website](#), which has been set up to resource Church of England schools to deliver high quality RSHE resources. The resources and approaches offered on this site give expert guidance on health, relationships and sex education, and on wider issues in the PSHE curriculum. They have been written primarily for Church of England Schools, but are appropriate for all schools to use.

Course Title: **Senior Leaders, Chairs & Incumbents**
Audience: Headteachers, Chairs of Governors and Incumbents

For Senior Leaders, Incumbents (or involved church lead) and Chairs of Governors from the same school to attend together. This course will guide you in ways to work effectively together to ensure the Christian distinctiveness of your church school is embedded. We will discuss how your ethos can enhance outcomes, how your vision gives direction, how Collective Worship is the heartbeat of the schools and how you can monitor and evidence your work through good governance.

Course Title: **Sharing the Story – serving the people of Devon with joy**
Audience: Volunteers from Schools and Churches

Would you like to become a 'Sharing the Story' school? This initiative links volunteers from churches with school pupils and can also be extended to include links with the home. It supports, develops and encourages the love and joy of reading as we know reading is key to young people accessing the wider curriculum and job opportunities in future life. This session focuses on training volunteers in the techniques of sharing a story. We are also excited to be partnering with the charity 'Silver Stories' so that schools and families, if they wish, can share their story telling techniques with a 'Silver Reader'.

Course Title: **Spiritual Development**
Audience: School staff

This course will enable teachers to gain a fuller understanding of what is meant by spirituality and spiritual development. It will provide clear and usable definitions for these difficult terms and consider why spiritual development is such an important aspect of the education we offer. We will be looking at how different people express their spirituality in so many different ways and discussing how schools can cater for this diversity. Practical help will be given to enable schools to identify when and where they are providing opportunities for spiritual development through collective worship, in subject areas and in the wider co-curriculum.

Course Title: **Understanding Christianity**
Audience: School Leaders, Teachers, Governors and Directors, church members

Understanding Christianity has been written by RE Today and gives in-depth support to the Christianity sections of the new Plymouth, Devon and Torbay RE syllabuses. It aims to develop pupils' understanding of key concepts in Christianity, as a contribution to their understanding of the world and their own experience within it. This three session course will give teachers full access to this outstanding and nationally recognised system of learning in RE.

Course Title: **Vision led Collective Worship in community primary schools**
Audience: School staff from community schools, and those involved in the delivery

How can collective worship shape who we are as a school community, exemplify our vision and promote our ethos? What are the characteristics of good Collective Worship and how well are we doing? How can we best support staff, pupils, and volunteers to make the most of the time? What resources are available that we can draw on? How does Collective Worship link with Spiritual Moral, Social and Cultural development (SMSC), mental health and wellbeing, and the wider curriculum? In this two-part course we will examine these questions in more detail and signpost resources to help you strengthen your provision.

- What are the legal expectations for Collective Worship in community schools and how can we make these times the heartbeat of the school day?
 - Planning, induction, resourcing, and cross-curricular links?

Course Title: **Vision, Prayer and Reflection**
Audience: School leaders, Governors, Directors and RE Leads

Prayer and reflection are powerful. Vision is energising. Combining these aspects enables a Church School to flourish. This session will focus on:

- Practical ways of embedding invitational prayer and opportunities for reflection into the daily life and culture of the school.
 - Prayer and reflection spaces in schools
 - Role of the Ethos Committee
 - Help – I'm not comfortable with unplanned prayer!

Clergy and Lay Leaders Training to support work with schools

Course Title: **Faith in the Nexus: A flourishing Nexus of School, Church, and Home**
Audience: Clergy and church teams

- Nurtures relationships between individuals, churches and schools
- Encourages spiritual leadership
- Offers time and space for reflection
- Provides a safe space to talk of faith and spiritual matters or ask challenging questions
- Gives a sense of belonging to a local Christian community

This session will unpack some of the research around this and together we will explore its possible relevance to your ministry in different contexts.

Course Title: **Inspiring Collective Worship with schools for church teams**
Audience: Clergy and church teams

The new [guidance document](#) identifies what best practice in terms of collective worship could look like in Church of England schools. In this course we will examine this in detail and enable you to take time to audit your current provision and reflect and make improvements.
