Free School Meals

We all know circumstances change and they can change quickly. Please use the link below to see if you qualify for Free School Meals. If you need help completing this please ask us.

The way parents/carers submit an application for FSM has now changed. There is now an on-line Portal where parents/carers can apply for FSM and an instant decision will be given. If the decision is that the child is eligible for FSM, the parent/carer must print the eligibility page and bring/send to the school or email to the school email address. The child will then be added onto the FSM list and the canteen can be informed.

Period Poverty

Amidst the worst cost of living crisis for 40 years, the new poll of 1,000 UK girls aged 14-21 reveals that over one in four (28%) are struggling to afford period products, and nearly 1 in 5 (19%) report being unable to afford period products at all since the start of 2022. (Plan International UK

St Peters making a difference

Period poverty is a challenge too many girls face when they should be concentrating on their schoolwork instead - 40% of girls in the UK have used toilet roll because they couldn't afford menstrual products and 68% said they felt less able to pay attention in class at school or college while menstruating. (Plan International UK)

Since 2020, the Government backed Period Poverty Taskforce has been working with all state-maintained schools to provide free period products until July 2024. We have carefully selected a comprehensive range of period products prioritising comfort, familiarity, and value for money. We want no student to feel embarrassment or shame in asking for period products. All female students will be able to:

- Access period products discreetly through student services, PE Department and named female staff
- All period products are given to students in a plain bag/envelope with no name or information on it
- Information will be available in all girls' toilets on where free period products can be accessed in school
- Awareness raising sessions to be delivered
- learners have all the safety information they need for each product available in a format they can access and understand

At St Peters, we want all learners to:

- Reduce the stigma
- Enable all girls to access period products when they need to
- Make sure girls know where and how to access products and which products are available.
