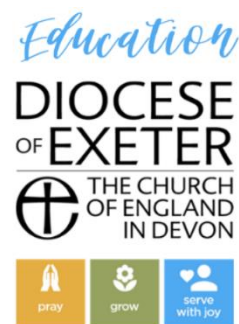

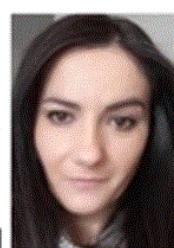

Diocesan Forums, Networks, Hubs and Retreat

Diocesan Network: Becoming Trauma-informed Schools Network (6 part network)

Audience: Trust / school leaders and all school staff

Do you want to know how to make your school more attuned to the needs of children and young people who have experienced trauma? These sessions focus on:

- different types of trauma children may experience, including single event, chronic and adverse childhood experiences,
- whole school approaches to trauma-informed practice to embed a culture which enables flourishing for all,
- supporting children and young people who have experienced bereavement and the impact of grief and loss,
- neuroscience and how trauma affects children’s brains, and how this helps us to provide support,
- overcoming barriers to learning with practical classroom strategies to support children whose development has been adversely impacted by traumatic early life experiences,
- supporting social functioning and relationships, leading to more positive interactions / behaviours in school,
- supporting children whose trauma is negatively impacting behaviour, including those at risk of exclusion.

This programme draws upon teaching from experts: Professor Eamon McCrory (UCL/ Anna Freud), Rebecca Brooks (Adoption UK), Louise Bomber (Touchbase), Kiran Gill (The Difference), David Trickey (UK Trauma Council) and Deborah Barnett (TLG).

Diocesan Network: Governance Forum

Audience: Governors, Directors, Trustees and Clerks

This network is for Governors and Trustees/Directors to meet with the Diocesan Education Team staff and others involved in governance. At each meeting we will highlight local and national initiatives that may have an impact on the governing boards of Church of England schools; give updates on topical issues; and opportunities; and signpost good practice and avenues for advice and support.

Diocesan Network: Leadership Forum for School Staff

Audience: All School Leaders (staff)

Join with the Education Team and other school leaders in this virtual network. At each meeting our aim is to provide a focussed and relevant specialist input session; to share diocesan updates, priorities and opportunities; to hear the things that are on your mind; and to signpost good practice and possible avenues of support.

Diocesan Network: MAT Leadership Forum

Audience: CEOs

The Diocesan MAT Leadership Forum meets termly to build our collective capacity to improve and serve our learners and families more effectively. Every MAT is encouraged to attend so that collectively we can:

- Create a strong and flourishing Church of England MAT network through identifying and sharing best practice;

- Exercise our moral responsibility and our Christian duty to work in the best interests of all learners and their families as they experience education for wisdom, hope, community and dignity and discover life in all its fullness;

 - Advise the Diocese of Exeter on matters relating to system leadership.

Diocesan Network: Retreat for School Leaders

Audience: School leaders

Rest and relaxation; good food and good conversation alongside times of stillness and silence. Mill House, a beautiful thatched farmhouse set in 7 acres of Devon countryside, combines the atmosphere of a centuries old building with the comfort of a modern home. Exploring spirituality is challenging - it helps you reconnect with yourself, with others, with God. It takes time to think about the pattern and rhythm of your life and you can do that here.

Diocesan Network: Secondary School Leadership Forum

Audience: Secondary School Leaders (staff)

There are five Church of England secondary schools in the Diocese of Exeter. This forum aims to bring leaders together to focus on matters relating specifically to secondary church schools but that may also be relevant to community schools. It is anticipated that two of the three sessions across the year will be school-based giving leaders the opportunity to learn from each other and support the development of secondary provision in our diocese. The Diocesan Education Team will help facilitate this forum, coming alongside you to share expertise, diocesan updates, priorities and opportunities. Community Secondary schools are welcome to join.

Audience: SIAMS leads, plus staff and Governance

Training and updates

Course Title: Admissions Updates

Audience: All involved in schools that are their own admissions authorities

This is an update to help guide you through the changes made to the Admissions Code and to know how they will impact your admission arrangements.

Course Title: An introduction to School Admissions and Appeals

Audience: All involved in schools that are their own admissions authorities

This workshop will comprehensively cover the development of high-quality admission arrangements and the specific content required by statute. We aim that attendee will leave the workshop with a clear understanding of the purpose of admission arrangements, the freedom to include or exclude particular practices, the procedure to follow for changing arrangements and a measure of the likely challenge. This workshop has been specifically organised during July 2023 in order that governors wishing to revise their arrangements on the back of the workshop experience will have time to prepare the documentation and consult during the statutory timeline.

Course Title: Clerks update

Audience: Clerks / Governance Professionals of maintained schools and academies

Information sharing sessions for new and existing clerks of maintained schools, MAT Boards and Local Governing Boards to help develop support networks and to keep everyone up to date with the latest developments and best practice. The session will be an interactive workshop session focusing on a specific topic or key competency and drilling down using shared experiences and best practice.

Course Title: Diocesan Conference - Residential

Audience: School leaders

Come together as a diocesan family of schools to focus on nurturing vision-inspired education, nourishing personal and spiritual growth and to enable connected communities that flourish. Full details to follow.

Course Title: Diversify for School Leadership Teams

Audience: School staff

Explore what the Equality Act means for your school and how you can actively work towards your school community becoming a more equitable environment, making sure opportunity really is open to all, not only in policy, but in practice.

Course Title: Diversify for Governance Teams

Audience: Governors, Directors, Local Committee members

Find out what your duties are under the Equality Act and how governors play a vital role in schools becoming a more equitable environment, making sure opportunity really is open to all, through policy and ethos.

Course Title: Ethos Groups and committees

Audience: Governors, Directors, Local Committee members, clerks, school leaders

Explore the purpose, roles and responsibilities of ethos groups and committees, including how to monitor effectively and link this back into future improvements.

Course Title: **Governor / Director Induction Training** (and useful as refresher training)
Audience: New Governors / Directors / Trustees

The Diocese of Exeter really values its Governors and wishes to ensure all those who take on this role have the appropriate knowledge and know where to seek support. As such, it is a requirement that all newly appointed Foundation Governors and Directors attend an induction session within twelve months of their appointment. The course is open to all categories of Governors and Directors of church schools and academies, and provides the following:

- Information on the different categories of schools and the responsibilities of governors in these categories;
- An overall understanding of Church school governance, including the role of the governor in new staff appointments, buildings and admissions;
- Information on Religious Education, Collective Worship and SIAMS;
- Opportunities to network with other church school governors and share good practice.

Course Title: **Governance Refresher Training**
Audience: Governors / Directors / Trustees reappointed to a Church school

Suitable for those in governance who have been reappointed for another term. This training is a refresher event for foundation governors that have been re-appointed as an alternative to revisiting the new governor training. Topics that will be covered include updates on RE, Collective Worship, admissions and buildings.

Course Title: **Inclusive, Invitational and Inspiring Collective Worship for schools**
Audience: People who contribute to Collective Worship in schools

The [guidance document](#) identifies what best practice in terms of collective worship could look like in Church of England schools. In this three-part course we will examine this in detail and enable you to take time to audit your current provision and reflect and make improvements.

- Auditing current provision and induction training for staff and volunteers
- Effective planning and resourcing with a church/school/home approach
- Festivals and diversity

Course Title: **Introduction to SIAMS**
Audience: School Leaders, Teachers, Governors and Directors

This course will introduce teachers and school leaders to the current SIAMS framework and self-evaluation form documents. It will offer guidance on what is inspected and how to prepare fully for a future SIAMS inspection. It is aimed at all staff and governors and will be an interactive, informative and enjoyable course. The course has been costed to encourage more than one member of staff/governor to attend.

Course Title: **Leading RE in the Primary School**
Audience: Primary RE teachers and RE Leads

The day will focus on the planning and delivery of high-quality learning in RE, exploring what intent, implementation, impact mean for the subject. The starting point will be a focus on enquiry-based learning promoted by the 2019 Devon and Torbay RE syllabus. We will look at the expectations on RE arising from the 2021 Ofsted RE Research Review, explore how to monitor and evaluate RE across the school and discuss what SIAMS will look for in relation to RE. We aim for all attending to leave with new ideas about how to lead learning in Religious Education and to inspire young people with the richness of experiences both within and beyond the classroom.

Course Title: MAT Director / Trustee Training
Audience: Directors / Trustees of MATs and SATs

This training is provided by the Education Team for existing and new academy trust Directors /Trustees and will cover:

- How governance in multi academy trusts works
- An overview of the duties and legal responsibilities of a Board of Trustees
- How the scheme of delegation works in practice

Course Title: MAT Member training
Audience: Academies only - Foundation Members

Foundation Members are an important part of academy governance. This event will provide information of how to be an effective Foundation Member, what the difference is between the corporation Foundation Member and an ordinary Foundation Member, as well as the opportunity to share best practice. This training is suitable for all Foundation Members of Single Academy Trusts (SATs) and Multi Academy Trusts (MATs).

Course Title: Multi-School Grouping Roadshow
Audience: School leaders, including all those involved in governance

The government is looking for all schools to move to Academy status by 2030. Do you know what this means in practice? What is a Multi-Academy Trust? The Diocese of Exeter currently has 17 Multi-Academy Trusts that have Church School Articles. They are all different. If church schools are looking to convert to academy status, they must join MATS with appropriate articles. Are you well-informed about what your options are? This session seeks to share knowledge and enable governance teams to consider different options.

Course Title: MAT Member training
Audience: Academies only - Foundation Members

Foundation Members are an important part of academy governance. This event will provide information of how to be an effective Foundation Member, what the difference is between the corporation Foundation Member and an ordinary Foundation Member, as well as the opportunity to share best practice. This training is suitable for all Foundation Members of Single Academy Trusts (SATs) and Multi Academy Trusts (MATs).

Course Title: New School Leaders Induction, including Evensong at the Cathedral
Audience: New school leaders

This is a chance to meet the Education Team and find out about the role of the diocese and how we will work together for the benefit of our school communities. There is also the opportunity to meet other leaders, have a tour of the cathedral and share refreshments together. This session ends with Evensong. We ask that all new school leaders attend – thank you.

Course Title: New to Church Schools

Audience: All staff new to working in church schools

These three one-hour sessions will introduce you to some of the key features about working in a church school. There will be a core input around school vision and SIAMS, spiritual development and collective worship and the opportunity to ask questions.

Course Title: Prayer Spaces in Schools

Audience: School &/or church representative (together ideally), governance

Prayer spaces enable children and young people, of all faiths and none, to explore life's questions, spirituality and faith in a safe, creative and interactive way. In the virtual training you will gain an understanding of how the church and school can work together to develop good inclusive practice when hosting prayer spaces and also gain practical ideas to make this happen. The face to face training covers the above and goes into more depth about how to recruit and train a great volunteer team, choosing the right location for your prayer space, gives detailed step-by-step guidelines to get you started and highlights a wealth of resources available for your use.

Course Title: RE Updates for Church of England Primary Schools

Audience: Primary RE teachers and RE Leads

This meeting will explore current issues for primary teachers of RE including: networking shared ideas; curriculum planning; worldviews and RE; leading and monitoring across the school; RE, Ofsted and SIAMS; what should RE look like in a Church school?

Course Title: RE Updates for Church of England Secondary Schools

Audience: Secondary RE teachers and RE Leads

This meeting will explore current issues for Church of England secondary RE teachers including: networking shared ideas; KS3/4 programmes and planning; GCSE updates; RE, Ofsted and SIAMS; what is a worldviews approach; what does RE look like in a Church school?

Course Title: Silver Stories – communicating across generations

Audience: All school staff and/or church teams

Find out more about this simple yet powerful project building relationships between the generations through a shared story. Find out more [here](#). Children (known as *Silver Readers*) telephone a *Silver Listener* every week and then read a short story or poem to them. This not only helps the children to become more confident in their reading skills but also links our children to the older members of our communities and helps diminish their chances of feeling isolated. Schools can decide, in consultation with Silver Listener, which is the best day and time of day for these calls to take place.

Course Title: Spiritual Development

Audience: School staff

This course will enable teachers to gain a fuller understanding of what is meant by spirituality and spiritual development. It will provide clear and usable definitions for these difficult terms and consider why spiritual development is such an important aspect of the education we offer. We will be looking at how different people express their spirituality in so many different ways and discussing how schools can cater for this diversity. Practical help will be given to enable schools to identify when and where they are providing opportunities for spiritual development through collective worship, in subject areas and in the wider co-curriculum.

Course Title: Understanding Christianity

Audience: School Leaders, Teachers, Governors and Directors, church members
