

Diocesan Networks, Events and Training Opportunities

An introduction to School Admissions and Appeals

Audience: All governance and staff involved in schools and trusts that are their own admissions authorities

This workshop will comprehensively cover the development of high-quality admission arrangements and the specific content required by statute. The aim is that each attendee will leave the training with a clear understanding of admission arrangements and procedures, the procedure to follow for changing arrangements and a measure of the likely challenge. This training has been specifically organised during July 2024 in order that governors/directors wishing to review and revise their admission arrangements will have time to prepare the documentation and consult during the statutory timeline. The training will also explain the admission appeals process.

Admissions Updates

Audience: All governance and staff involved in schools and trusts that are their own admissions authorities

This is an update to help guide you through any recent changes and adjudication decisions and how they will impact your admission arrangements.

Clerks Update

Audience: Clerks/Governance Professionals

Information sharing sessions for new and existing clerks of maintained schools, and clerks and governance professional of Trust Boards / Local Governing Boards to help develop support networks and to keep everyone up to date with the latest developments and best practice. The session will be an interactive workshop focusing on a specific topic or key competency and drilling down using shared experiences and best practice.

Day of Reaffirmation and Thanksgiving

Audience: All those involved in Governance, including School Leaders

Join the Education Team in the Bishop Palace's Garden where a marquee and light refreshments await us. We wish to thank you and reaffirm you in your roles of Foundation Governors/Directors, clerks/governance professionals and school leaders. More details to follow but please do hold the date.

Governor/Director Induction Training (and useful as refresher training)

Audience: New Governors/Directors

The Diocese of Exeter really values its Governors and Directors and wishes to ensure all those who take on this role have the appropriate knowledge and know where to seek support. As such, it is a requirement that all newly appointed Foundation Governors and Directors attend an induction session within twelve months of their appointment. The course is open to all categories of Governors and Directors of church schools and academies, and provides the following:

- Information on the different categories of schools and the responsibilities of governance in these categories;
- An overall understanding of Church school governance, including the role of the governor/director in new staff appointments, buildings and school admissions;
- Information on Religious Education, Collective Worship and SIAMS and how these are monitored;
- Opportunities to network with other church school governors/directors and share good practice.

Governance Forum

Audience: Governors, Directors, Trustees and Clerks

This forum is an opportunity to meet with the Diocesan Education Team staff and others involved in governance. At each meeting we focus on governance in Church of England Schools to share good practice, to highlight local and national initiatives, to highlight opportunities and offer support and guidance. We encourage governors and directors to join other individuals from our diocesan family of schools.

Governance Refresher Training

Audience: Governors/Directors reappointed to a Church school/Trust

Suitable for those in governance who have been reappointed for another term of office. This training is a refresher event for foundation governors/directors that have been re-appointed as an alternative to revisiting the governance induction training. Topics that will be covered include updates on RE, Collective Worship, SIAMS and school admissions.

Inclusive, Invitational and Inspiring Collective Worship for schools

Audience: People who contribute to Collective Worship in schools

Using the <u>C of E Collective Worship document</u> we will explore how to refine our current collective worship practice to be more inclusive, invitational and inspiring. Come with ideas to share and an openness to try new things.

Leadership Forum for School Staff

Audience: All School Leaders (staff)

Join with the Education Team and other school leaders in this virtual network. At each meeting our aim is to provide a focussed and relevant specialist input session; to share diocesan updates, priorities and opportunities; to hear the things that are on your mind; and to signpost good practice and possible avenues of support.

Learn Teach Lead RE Conference

This conference will explore topics including religious and non-religious worldviews, big questions, essential knowledge, multi-disciplinary RE, assessment, exam techniques and other fresh methods. We will share ideas about the way the new Agreed Syllabus will be changing, to be introduced for September 2024. For more information click <u>here</u>.

MAT Director Training

Audience: Directors of MATs

This training is provided by the Education Team for existing and new academy trust Directors and will cover:

- How governance in multi academy trusts works
- An overview of the duties and legal responsibilities of a Board of Directors
- How the scheme of delegation works in practice

MAT Member Training

Audience: Academies only - Foundation Members

Foundation Members are an important part of academy governance. This event will provide information of how to be an effective Foundation Member, what the difference is between the corporation Foundation Member and an ordinary Foundation Member, as well as the opportunity to share best practice. This training is suitable for all Foundation Members of Single Academy Trusts (SATs) and Multi Academy Trusts (MATs).

MAT Leadership Forum

Audience: CEOs

The Diocesan MAT Leadership Forum meets termly to build our collective capacity to improve and serve our learners and families more effectively. Every MAT is encouraged to attend so that collectively we can:

- Create a strong and flourishing Church of England MAT network through identifying and sharing best practice;
- Exercise our moral responsibility and our Christian duty to work in the best interests of all learners and their families as they experience education for wisdom, hope, community and dignity and discover life in all its fullness;
- Strengthen every MAT through peer support and challenge;
- Advise the Diocese of Exeter on matters relating to system leadership.

New School Leaders Induction, including Evensong at the Cathedral

Audience: New school leaders

This is a chance to meet the Education Team and find out about the role of the diocese and how we will work together for the benefit of our school communities. There is also the opportunity to meet other leaders, have a tour of the cathedral and share refreshments together. This session ends with Evensong. We ask that all new school leaders attend – thank you.

Prayer Spaces in Schools

Audience: School &/or church representative (together ideally), governance

Prayer spaces enable children and young people, of all faiths and none, to explore life's questions, spirituality and faith in a safe, creative and interactive way. In this face to face training you will gain an understanding of how the church and school can work together to develop good inclusive practice when hosting prayer spaces and also gain practical ideas to make this happen. Also included is information on how to recruit and train a great volunteer team, choosing the right location for your prayer space, detailed step-by-step guidelines to get you started and signposting to a wealth of resources available for your use.

School Leaders' Gathering - Residential or Day Delegate

Audience: School/School Grouping Leaders

Two options are available for the School Leaders' Gathering. The first is as a residential delegate, alongside colleagues from our diocesan family of schools, for an afternoon/evening of spiritual refreshment and fellowship before being joined by delegates the following morning. The second is to attend as a day delegate only as we hear from our keynote speakers. The emphasis will be on Courageous Advocacy - full details will follow.

Secondary School Leadership Forum

Audience: Secondary School Leaders (staff)

There are five Church of England secondary schools in the Diocese of Exeter. This forum aims to bring leaders together to focus on matters relating specifically to secondary church schools - this year this will be RE. It is anticipated that two of the three sessions across the year will be virtual and one school-based. The Diocesan Education Team will help facilitate this forum, coming alongside you to share expertise, diocesan updates, priorities, and opportunities. Community Secondary schools are welcome to join.

Secondary School – Courageous Advocacy

Audience: Secondary School Leaders (staff)

Do you want to know more about Courageous Advocacy and how it benefits students in a range of different ways? Do you want to foster a culture of social justice and advocacy across your school? This session will explore:

- The rationale behind courageous advocacy, identifying a range of opportunities for your students to become 'Agents of Change'.
- Encouraging your students to ask 'Why?' and why this is crucial to 'living life in all its fullness'.
- How the Archbishops' Young Leaders Award can help support your students develop the knowledge, skills
 and confidence to speak out against injustice, promote equality and work towards a more sustainable and
 equitable future.

SIAMS Hubs

Audience: SIAMS leads, plus staff and Governance

These are informal meetings designed to support Church of England schools in the development of their Christian distinctiveness; act as a forum at which to share information about SIAMS related matters; allow sharing of ideas and best practice; and give an opportunity for the exploration and discussion of any challenges.

SIAMS – New Framework Training

Audience: School Leaders, Teachers, Governors and Directors

This course will introduce teachers and school leaders to the SIAMS framework and self-evaluation form documents. It will offer guidance on what is inspected and how to prepare fully for a future SIAMS inspection. It is aimed at all staff and governors and will be an interactive, informative and enjoyable course. The course has been costed to encourage more than one member of staff/governor to attend.

Time to recharge – Spiritual Refreshment

Audience: School staff, those involved in governance and regular school volunteers

Time to Recharge sessions aim to give you time, as spiritual leaders in your schools, for your own spiritual refreshment and nourishment. This inclusive (and non-threatening) virtual session seeks to give you space to reflect, pray and be refreshed as a valued member of our diocesan family. It is open to all school staff, those involved in governance and regular volunteers. The sessions last no more than 20 minutes.
