

He was lead bishop on education and has long been enthusiastic for the ministry of chaplains. 

National Society Council Living in Love and Faith: Next steps for NS

Paper NSC(23)14

As a key part of their work following the February 2023 sessions of Synod, the bishops commit to working with the National Society to consider the following:

- i. How to strengthen the relationship between a school and its parish church, even where there are significant differences of approach among clergy, congregations, and the school leadership in relation to issues of identity, sexuality and relationships.
- ii. How to help with navigating different views held within the Church on questions of sexuality especially in delivering relationships and sex education.
- iii. Provision of guidance on how best to support young people in school who are exploring their gender identity and sexuality.
- iv. How collective worship can be used well in exploring questions of identity and relationships.
- v. How to create a safe school environment for staff, pupils and family members who identify as LGBTQI+, together with those who hold to the traditional teaching of that church.

This work will lead to the production of an updated version of the Guidance for Church of England

schools, *Valuing All God's Children*. I am a part of a working group so if you have any questions about this work or specific advice I can help you with please do get in touch.
