

completing Tax Returns and crucially a breakdown of the expenses that new curates can claim within their roles. The will arm all new curates with the knowledge required so that they can go into their first year with confidence knowing what is expected of them from a taxation point of view. There is a question and answer session at the end to answer any queries that come up.



Structure and Theology of Mark

Richard Burridge

Tuesday 17th October 9.20am - 3.30pm

This day explores the structure and overview of Mark, make us think about how we might approach the issues of preaching from Mark, and stimulate us with new insights on an old friend.



The Revd Canon Professor Richard A. Burridge is an internationally recognised biblical scholar, ethicist, theologian and social commentator, who has published over a dozen books and hundreds of other articles or publications. He was Dean of King's College London from 1993 to 2019. Now a Research Fellow in the Department of Theology at the University of Manchester, and a Visiting Professor at Virginia Theological Seminary, USA, he devotes his time to research and writing, as well as his public ministry lecturing and undertaking theological training for clergy and lay people. In addition to his academic work his best-selling Four Gospels, One Jesus? has made biblical scholarship accessible to a wider audience. His academic scholarship and his contribution to the life of the world-wide church was recognised when he was awarded the 2013 Ratzinger Prize by Pope Francis, the first non-Roman Catholic to receive this prestigious prize. First Aid

This course will cover candidates for emergency first aid for adults coming into the church. Course will cover Sudden collapse, accident procedure. CPR, Bleeding, head injuries common medical injuries and burns. The course is delivered through a practical approach with ongoing assessment.

Level 3 Paediatric First Aid (ITC)

2 days - Thursday 2nd November and Friday 17th November

This course covers all of the content from the Emergency First Aid course but will also cover working with children (under 18's) the course will look at how to deal with first Aid incidents with a larger focus on young people. The course is delivered through a practical approach with ongoing assessment.

Matt Upston - Matt has been teaching first aid for over 20 years and delivers courses to all ages and levels of need. He is a member of the Heavitree community involved in lots of different activities including running fitness classes, Chair of Governors at St Michaels primary, running children's events and supporting ParkLife. 





Preaching in Advent

Revisiting Advent and Christmas course

Liturgical, theological and pastoral opportunities for Advent and Christmas

As we reach Harvest, our minds will already be turning to how we will observe Advent and Christmas in our parishes and communities, and in our own devotional life.

This half-day online course will seek to revisit the distinctive themes of this wonderful period of the Christian year, focusing particularly on Advent and Christmas, but noting also how this season is connected to those that immediately precede and follow it.

Advent and Christmas have distinctive liturgical opportunities, theological and doctrinal themes that emerge through the Scriptures which we read as we move through the season, and perhaps more opportunity for pastoral engagement than any other time of the year in church, school, home, and the civic environment. It can seem overwhelming as well as wonderful, particularly given the busyness of ministry in our current age. How might we sift and arrange all of these opportunities to deliver an Advent and Christmas that has the potential to really connect?

In half a day we won't be able to plumb all of these depths, but there will be opportunity for input, reflection, conversation, and the sharing of best practice.

Autumn Lecture Series 2023 Here I Stand, I Can Do No Other St Martin-in-the-Fields

This year's St Martin-in-the-Fields Autumn Lecture Series, inspired by the celebrated words of Martin Luther during the Reformation in 1521, investigates those things in which we believe deeply – and for which we would be prepared to make a costly stand. Each of our lecturers address this question through their lives and perspectives. We hear from those who have lived for the things they believed in, as they offer insight, prophecy, challenge, controversy, hope, warning, courage and vision. These are people who have inspired and empowered but have also faced opposition and sometimes attack.

This autumn we have the privilege to listen to distinguished speakers articulating the principles from which nothing would persuade them to back down. It promises to be an exhilarating experience.

The series takes place at St Martin-in-the-Fields with a live audience in the building. The lectures are also live-streamed. The suggested price for tickets is £10 to cover our costs, but free tickets are also available so as not to exclude anyone who would like to come. ALL ARE WELCOME.
