



Domestic Abuse Training:

The aim of this training is to equip participants to engage thoughtfully and proactively with the issue of domestic abuse and those affected. The Domestic Abuse training is for anyone holding the Bishop's licence, commission, authorisation, or permission (Clergy, PTO, Readers, Licenced Lay Ministers), Bishops Visitors / Pastoral Visitors, Parish Safeguarding Representatives, Ordinands (during IME1), PCC Members / Lay Chapter Members, staff at Theological Education Institutions with student facing roles and members of the Diocesan Safeguarding Advisory Panel.
