



JANUARY PRAYER DIARY

Reflecting on the words of Hebrews Philippians 3:13-14, we pray:

Lord, thank you that your mercies are new every morning, and that you forgive us every time we fall short. Help us to move forward this year instead of looking backward, to keep running the race you have set before us, towards the ultimate goal of eternity with you.

Monday 1st – Saturday 6th

As a New Year begins and we make plans for the year ahead, help us to hold them loosely, may our main desire be to serve you, to learn more about you, to spend more time with you, and to tell others about you, praying in all things that your will would be done.

1. On New Year's Day, we reflect on the highs and lows from the year that has passed, thank you that you were with us through it all, teaching us and comforting us. May we hold onto you this year, knowing you will continue to show us the way.
2. On St Basil's Day, we remember the life of Basil of Caesarea who cared for the sick and hungry and transformed lives in the name of Jesus.
