Time for Stillness

In the November newsletter I wrote about the idea that 'all things are in a state of flux'. The world is constantly changing, nothing stays the same. For this reason, it is often helpful to seek opportunities for stillness. The world's religious traditions each, in their own way, create pathways for people to draw aside from their busy lives to seek silence, giving opportunities for spiritual reflection.

Try setting up reflective sessions where pupils can experience stillness, whether in the classroom or in a forest school context. Here are some suggested sites to explore. Evoking Genocide in Photography

In this talk, Professor Adam Jones will introduce his work on photographing sites and evidence of genocide and discuss the wider context of how photography has been so crucial in making society aware of instances of mass violence. There are nonetheless challenges with how the camera has been used in this context, and Jones' talk will consider some of the complications of how the concept of genocide has developed alongside photography.

Adam Jones is Professor of Political Science at the University of British Columbia in Kelowna. He is best known for his work in the field of comparative genocide studies. He is the author or editor of numerous books on genocide and crimes against humanity, including the recent 4th edition of *Genocide: A Comprehensive Introduction*
